Summary of the Friday Sermon

Delivered by Hadhrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad (atba)

Hudhur (atba) delivered this Friday Sermon on 7th May on the subject of the Divine attribute of Al Khaliq (The Creator) and opened by reciting verse 4 of Surah Al Fatir: **'O ye men, remember the favour of Allah towards you. Is there any Creator other than Allah Who provides for you from the heaven and earth? There is none worthy of worship but He. Whither then are you turned away?'** (35:4)

Explaining the meanings of the word Khaliq Hudhur (atba) said according to lexicon Khaliq connotes one who makes something, and to create without any matter, as the Qur'an states: **'Allah created the heavens and the earth...'** (29:45) It also states, **'He is the Originator of the heavens and the earth...'** (2:118) and **'...Who created you from a single soul and created...'** (4:2) and **'Verily, We created man from an extract of clay;'** (23:13).

Hudhur (atba) said Hadhrat Musleh Maud (ra) explained that here 'originates creation' signifies established dignity of a body of people and 'repeating it' signifies to once again generate a spirit of alertness in them. Hudhur (atba) said the progress of a body of people is only with the grace of God and does not come to pass of its own accord. Here the attention of Muslims is drawn that their triumph will come about with God's help, and there is no need for any extremist

group for this. Triumph will be sought by absorbing God's grace and for this purpose the Promised Messiah (as) was sent. The tool to accomplish triumph that he gave us with God's help is the power of reasoning and God has told us that all this will come to pass through prayers. If Muslims wish to witness rejuvenation they need to accept the Messiah and turn to God and not to extremism. It is the obligation of Ahmadis to remember the principle that without God's help they can neither attain material provisions nor spiritual provisions. Some times, some Ahmadis seem to forget this. Hudhur (atba) said that is why he always admonishes to be regular in Salat. Some times when people request Hudhur (atba) for prayers he can tell from their faces that they are only asking as a ritual. Upon asking they tell that they are not regular in Salat. Hudhur (atba) said it was most dreadful even if one person among us was such. Hudhur (atba) said a father and a son came to see him and the father said the son was negligent about his Salat and stayed involved in his business. Hudhur (atba) said the son had come to ask for prayers for his business. Hudhur (atba) told him that he appeared to be joking with God. Hudhur (atba) said in order to attain God's grace we need to worship Him and this is indeed the biggest reason for the creation of mankind. 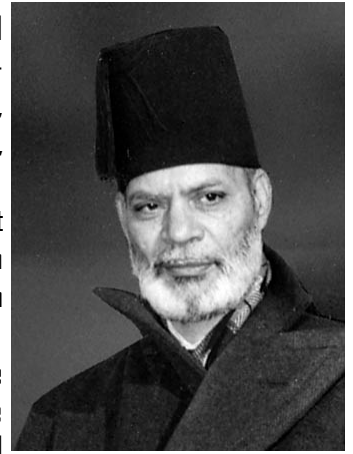
Personality of the Month

Sir Chaudhry Muhammad Zafrulla Khan (ra)

- Born on February 6, 1893, in Sialkot Pakistan.
- Acquired primary education at the American Mission School, Sialkot.
- Saw the Founder of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Movement on September 3, 1904 in Lahore. (since that day Sir Zafarullah Khan (ra) considered himself to be an Ahmadi).
- Graduated from the Government College, Lahore, in 1911.
- Went to England in August, 1911 and remained there until November, 1914. During this period he studied at King's College, London, and was called to the Bar at Lincoln's Inn. During this period Chaudhry Sahib (ra) also had the occasion to visit various places in England, Switzerland and Germany, where he zealously propagated articles of his faith.
- Remained the Amir of the Ahmadiyya Jamaat Lahore during the period 1919 to 1935.
- Presented the Book "Tuhfa Shehzada Wales" (A Gift for the Prince of Wales) to H.R.H the Prince of Wales, in February 1922.
- Read the paper of Hadhrat Khalifatul Masih II (ra) at the Conference of the World's Religions held in Wembley Hall, London, in 1924.
- Participated in the Round Table Conferences held in the years 1930, 1931, and 1932.
- Presented a Complimentary Memorandum to the Viceroy of India (Earl of Willingdon) on behalf of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Jama'at, in March 1934.
- Became the Minister of Railways of India in May, 1935.
- Was appointed Judge of the Federal Court of India in September 1941, which post he held until June 1947.
- Again in 1944, at the instance of Hadhrat Khalifatul Masih II (ra), joined in the noble work of translation of the Holy Quran into various languages.
- At the request of the Quaid-e-Azam Mohammad Ali Jinnah, represented the Muslim League in July 1947 before Radcliffe Boundary Commission and presented the case of the Muslims in a highly commendable manner.
- In December 1947, represented Pakistan in The United Nations' General Assembly as the head of the Pakistan delegation and advocated the stand of the Muslim world on the Palestinian issue.
- Was appointed by the Quaid-e-Azam as Pakistan's (first) Foreign Minister which post he held from December 25, 1947 till 1954.
- During 1948 to 1954, represented Pakistan at the Security Council

and admirably advocated the case of liberation of the occupied Kashmir, Libya, North Ireland, Eritrea, Somalia, Sudan, Tunisia, Morocco, and Indonesia.

- Presented to the US President the second edition of the English Translation of the Holy Quran, in January 1951.
 - In 1954, became Judge of the International Court of Justice, The Hague, Holland, which post he held till 1961.
 - Laid the foundation of a place of worship in the Hague, Holland, in June 1955.
 - Became the Vice President of the International Court of Justice, the Hague, Holland, in the year 1958, which post he held till 1961.
 - In 1960, at the request of an organisation of the US, wrote a book called: "Islam - its Meaning for Modern Man".
 - From 1961 to 1964, remained Pakistan's Permanent Representative at the UN.
 - In 1962, met US President Kennedy and discussed the Kashmir issue with him.
 - From 1962 to 1963, was President of the UN General Assembly.
 - Translated the Holy Quran in English in the year 1970.
 - In 1970, was elected President of the International Court of Justice, The Hague, Holland, which post he held until 1973.
 - Stayed in England during the period 1973 to 1983.
- Came back to Pakistan in 1983 till his death in Lahore, on September 1, 1985, after a protracted illness. (www.alislam.org)

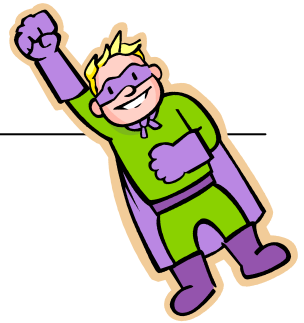

A Short History of Real Madrid C.F.

Real Madrid Club de Fútbol, commonly known as **Real Madrid** (and in Spain, in football circles, simply as **el Madrid**) is a professional association football club based in Madrid, Spain. It is the most successful team in Spanish football and was voted by FIFA as the most successful club of the 20th century, having won a record thirty-one La Liga titles, seventeen Spanish Cups, a record nine European Cups and two UEFA Cups. Real Madrid was a founding member of FIFA and the now-defunct G-14 group of Europe's leading football clubs as well as its replacement, the European Club Association. The word "Real" in the club's name is the Spanish term for "Royal", and was added in 1920 together with the royal crown in the emblem.



Founded in 1902, Real Madrid has spent its entire history in the top flight of Spanish football. The club established itself as a major force in both Spanish and European football during the 1950s. In the 1980s, the club had one of the best teams in Spain and Europe, winning two UEFA Cups, five consecutive Spanish championships, one Spanish cup and three Spanish Super Cups.

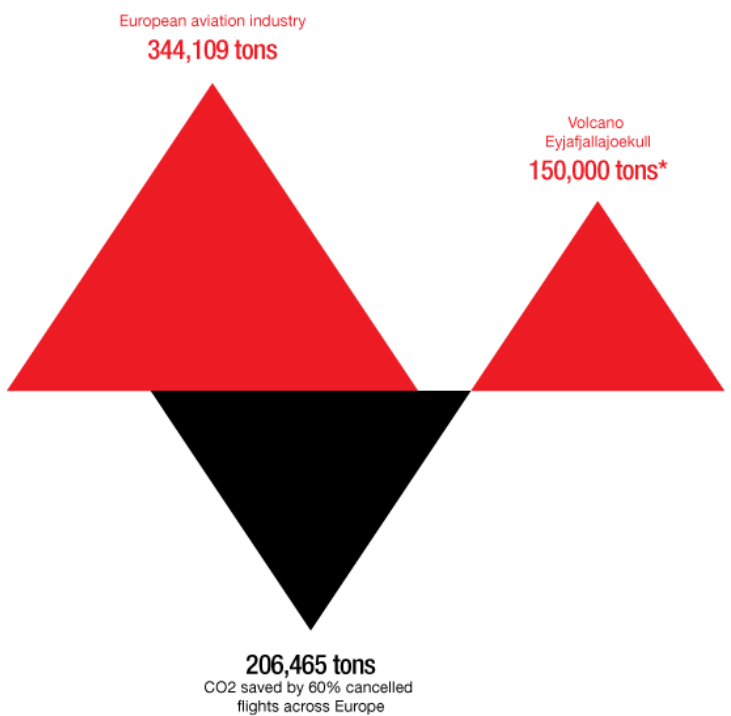
